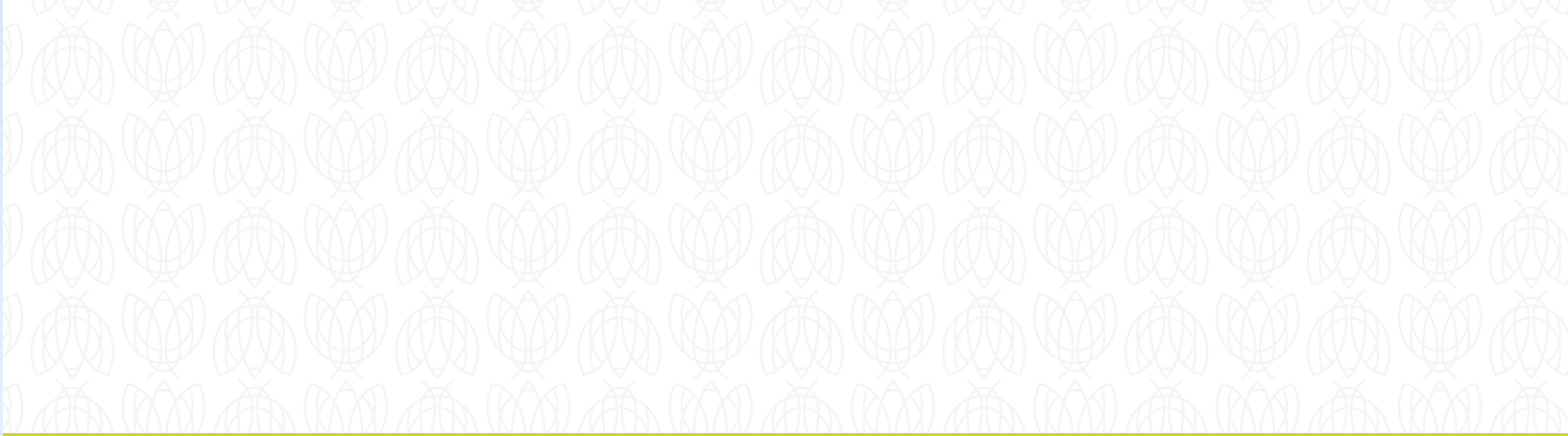

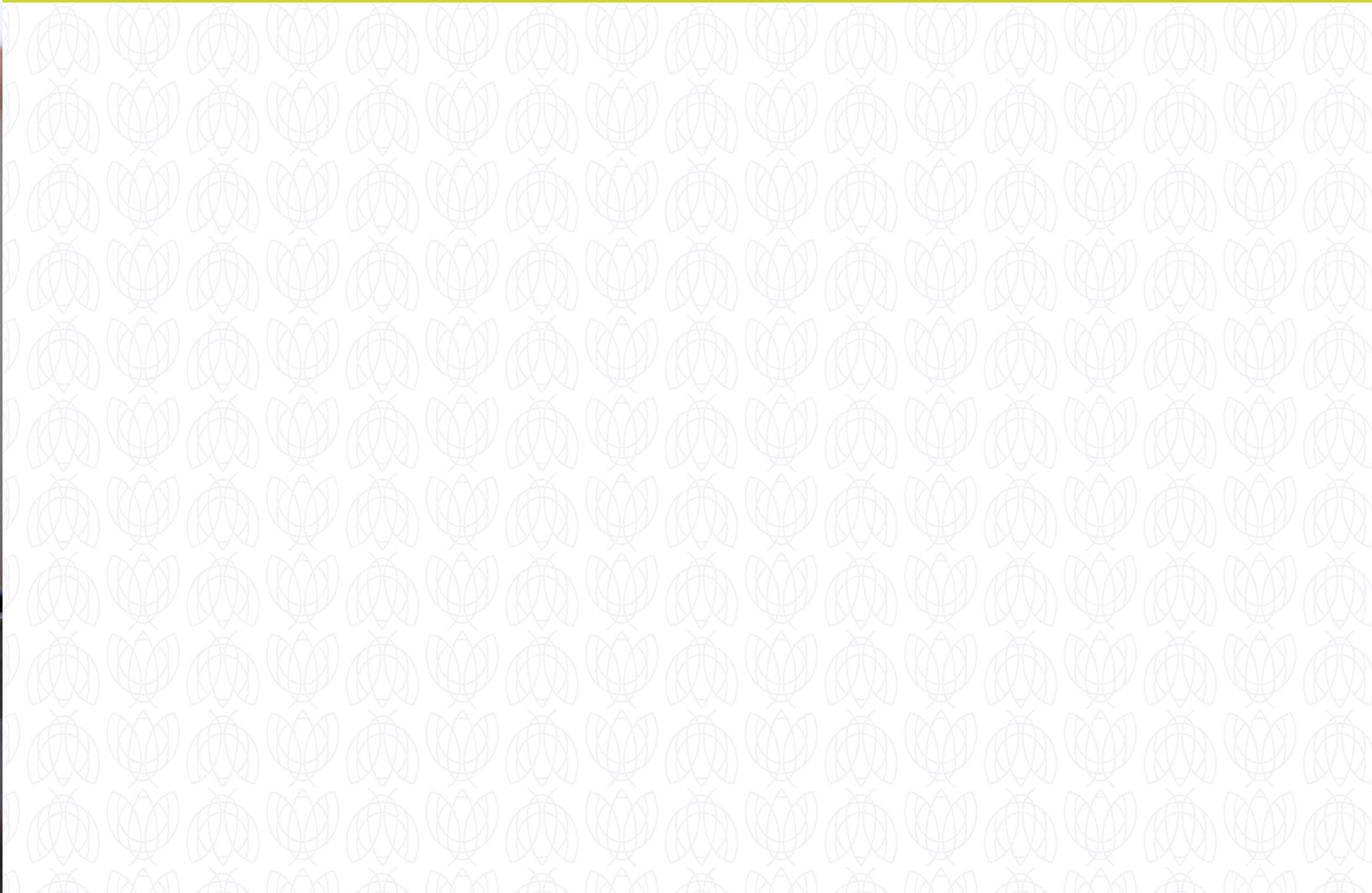

**L**ast year, 2020, had more than its share of changed plans for us all. Your new Museum began the year with record setting daily attendance at the Fun Day programs, and field trips were in such high demand that we opened back up on Mondays during the school season. All was going exceedingly well and according to the plan, that is, until we had to close our doors for nearly four months (March - June) due to the worldwide coronavirus pandemic.

**It was time to get creative!** Initially structured for school field trips, we retooled and modified the guest experience and programming to accommodate, add value, and remain relevant during such unprecedented and cautious times. We launched workshops, Lunch & Learn presentations, camps, family activities, and classes. Wow! What a timely ray of hope and encouragement that we were now responsible for his care beyond a single generation!

As we carefully and strategically enhanced programming and operations, we saw a tremendously positive response from the community, which the Membership growth reflects. **Thank you** for your continued partnership in such a meaningful endeavor, that with your support and use, will allow generations to meet Kale and discover Life is Amazing!

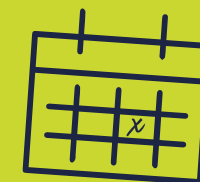

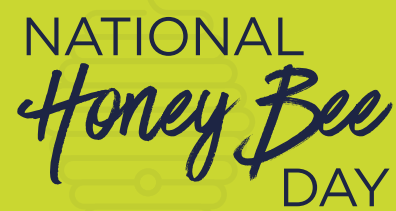
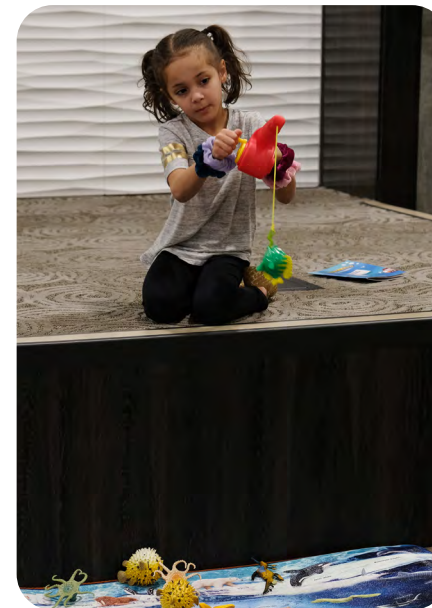


# PROGRAMS

## **CARE & CONSERVATION**

**M**exican alligator lizards are endangered and live only in a small area of Mexico. Being viviparous (giving birth to live babies) and having a prehensile tail to enable them to climb high in cloud forests make these lizards unique and amazing.

The Cook Museum was excited to have four babies born in our care turn 1-year-old in May 2020. The Animal Care department continues to raise this endangered species and educate visitors on the importance of conservation and care of animals.

## KALE COMES HOME

**K**ale, a non-releasable Kemp's ridley sea turtle, came to the Cook Museum in June of 2020 and is housed in the Museum's 15,000-gallon saltwater aquarium located inside the Oceans Exhibit.

Kale came from the Virginia Aquarium and Marine Science Center, a facility that rescues and rehabilitates sea turtles and other marine animals so they can be released back into the wild.



Kale, while still a juvenile, was hooked by a recreational fisherman off a pier on Chesapeake Bay in Virginia in 2019. Due to his injuries, it was determined that Kale would require medical attention from time to time, making him a non-releasable sea turtle.

Cook Museum staff and veterinarians now monitor his condition and give him the care he needs to have a chance at a long and happy life.

The Kemp's ridley sea turtle is currently listed as "Critically Endangered" by the International Union for Conservation of Nature (IUCN) and has been on the U.S.'s endangered species list since the 1970s.

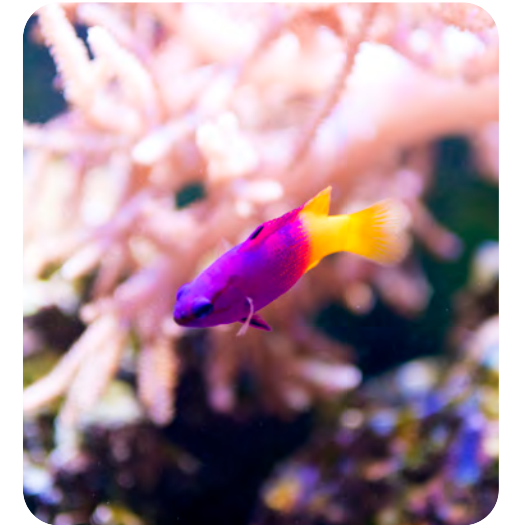

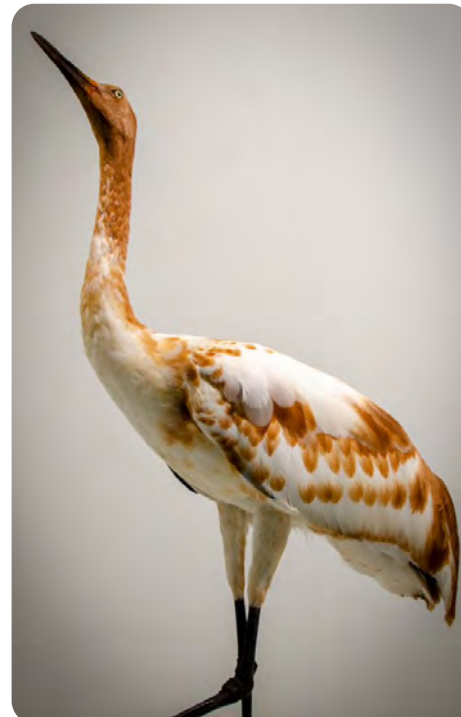

**T**he Cook Museum was excited to also place two additional endangered animals on display in the terrariums in the Discover Exhibit, the eastern hellbender and the eastern indigo snake. These animals are used to educate visitors on the importance of habitat protection and ways to help endangered species.

## EXHIBIT ENHANCEMENTS

At the Cook Museum we are always working on ways to enhance the Exhibits, create more unique experiences, and engage visitors. Some additions of note in 2020 include:

- Received a juvenile whooping crane specimen from the International Crane Foundation for the Rivers & Streams Exhibit (installed in January 2021)
- The addition of the Ant Slider interactive to the Little Larvae play area
- The Zipper Up interactive in the Birds Exhibit
- The alligator tank in Discover and freshwater tank in Rivers & Streams were renovated

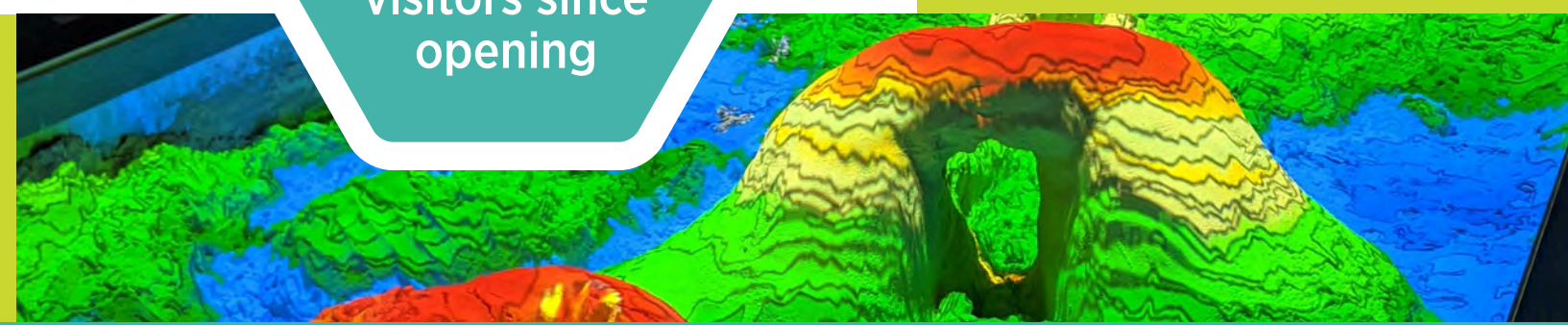

Animal Care worked diligently at the Museum throughout all of the changes brought by the closure. While many things changed this year, the excellent care for the animals did not!



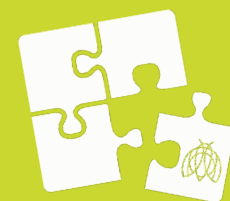
During the closure, the off-site beehives still received routine checks and care to ensure that they had everything they needed to thrive.

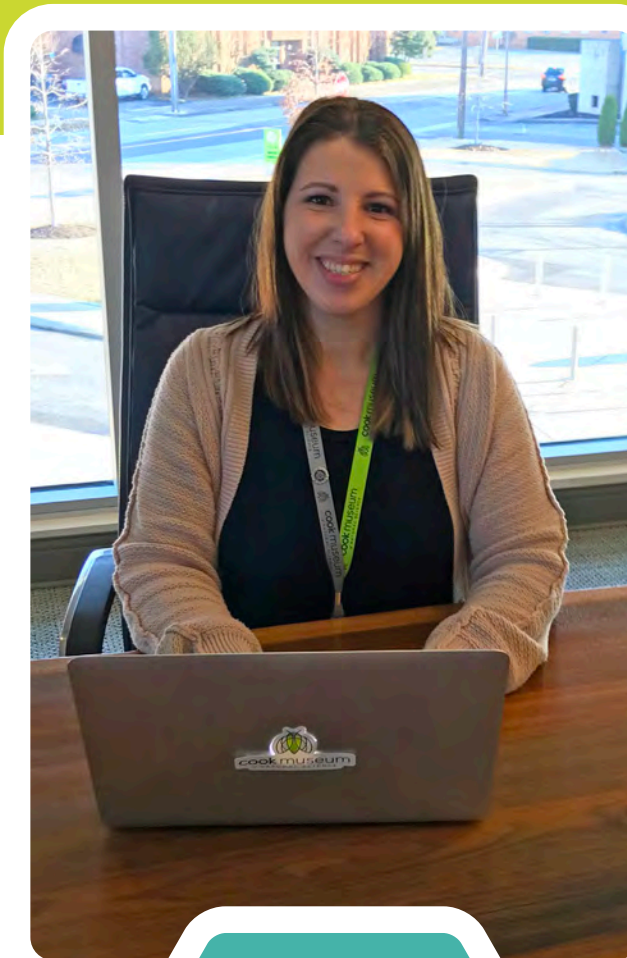
## EDUCATION SPONSORSHIPS
